KODIAK HISTORICAL SOCIETY ARCHIVES EXPLANATION OF DEED OF GIFT

The deed of gift is a legal agreement that transfers ownership of and legal rights to the items donated. Executing a deed is in the best interests of both the donor and the Kodiak Historical Society.

Description of Property: A representative of the Kodiak Historical Society will complete the “Description of Property” section, which will briefly list the materials being transferred.

Property Rights: The Kodiak Historical Society reserves the right to determine the disposition of the donated materials unless otherwise noted by the donor(s). The Kodiak Historical Society will administer these materials in accordance with the standards of archival and/or library practice; including decisions regarding location, retention, arrangement, cataloging, and preservation. Some documents may need reformatting. Photocopying, microfilming, or digitization can help preserve fragile items by preventing the need for researchers to handle the original documents.

Copyrights: The Kodiak Historical Society encourages donors to transfer any literary rights which they may possess to the Kodiak Historical Society to enable researchers and scholars to quote readily from papers. If a donor wants the assignment of copyright to be conditional, a donor may note the limitations as either “Copyright retained during my lifetime” or something similar in the space provided.

Copyright for writings, photographs, and other original material usually belongs to the creator or their legal heirs. Donors can only transfer literary rights that they own, but can transfer physical property rights for the works of others in the materials donated.

Access Restriction: Although our goal is to make material available to all researchers, we realize that some items contain sensitive or personal information. In such cases, donors may place reasonable restrictions on use of a collection or a portion of a collection. Any restrictions mutually agreed to by the donor and the Kodiak Historical Society will be for a specific period of time.

Change in Provisions: If a donor feels that any terms in the agreement should be deleted, the donor is encouraged to discuss that matter with the Kodiak Historical Society Archivist Daria Safronova-Simeonoff to verify that the desired change is feasible.

The deed of gift verifies the relationship between the donor and the Kodiak Historical Society. This relationship ensures the materials you donate will be available to future generations. We thank you for your support.
